NESP News and Updates

In May, NESP and ACES (A Community on Ecosystem Services) hosted <u>a forum for federal decision makers</u> on the use of ecosystem services accounting and valuation in natural resource management planning and decisions. Participants shared experiences from their own efforts to incorporate ecosystem services and discussed ways to draw from these efforts to help inform future resource management planning and decisions. There was a consensus among participants on the need for guidance to make ecosystem services approaches to planning and management more routine and tractable for resource managers. Participants included members of the US Forest Service, US Geological Survey, US Bureau of Land Management, US Environmental Protection Agency, USDA Office of Environmental Markets, Natural Resource Conservation Service, National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration, Army Corps of Engineers, Department of the Interior, Department of Defense, Fish and Wildlife Service, White House Office of Management and Budget, and the White House Council on Environmental Quality.

NESP will work with its partner organizations and agencies to design a plan for creating this guidance by working through real examples with agency partners. In addition, NESP will work with federal agencies to continue discussion on this topic

at the Ecosystem Services Partnership Meeting on July 31- August 4 in Portland, Oregon, and again at the ACES/EM/ESP Florida meeting on December 10-14.
