NESP News and Updates

NESP is planning to host three special sessions at the upcoming <u>ACES (A Community on Ecosystem Services)</u> conference Dec. 10-14 on the following topics:

- 1. The use of ecosystem services in state-level planning and decision making
- 2. The use of ecosystem services in International government planning and decision making
- NESP's recent work and next steps in the development of a federal guide on the use of ecosystem services approaches in planning and resource management

To better target NESP's work on this federal guidebook, NESP will be conducting an assessment of the new forest planning rule to understand the characteristics of specific decision points where an ecosystem-services-based approach might be useful. The goal of this work is to help NESP understand where and when the use of ecosystem services is useful to decision makers and resource managers, which frameworks are currently used or referenced during decision making, and which elements would be needed for a successful cross-agency framework for ecosystem-services-based decision making.

In July 2011, the President's Council of Advisors on Science and Technology (PCAST) released a report on ecosystem services. NESP is currently engaged in the federal agency process to develop a stakeholder response to the PCAST report. Feedback is being compiled from multi-stakeholder events held throughout 2012, including the federal policy forum in May, the Ecosystem Services Partnership meeting in August, and the upcoming ACES conference in December.
